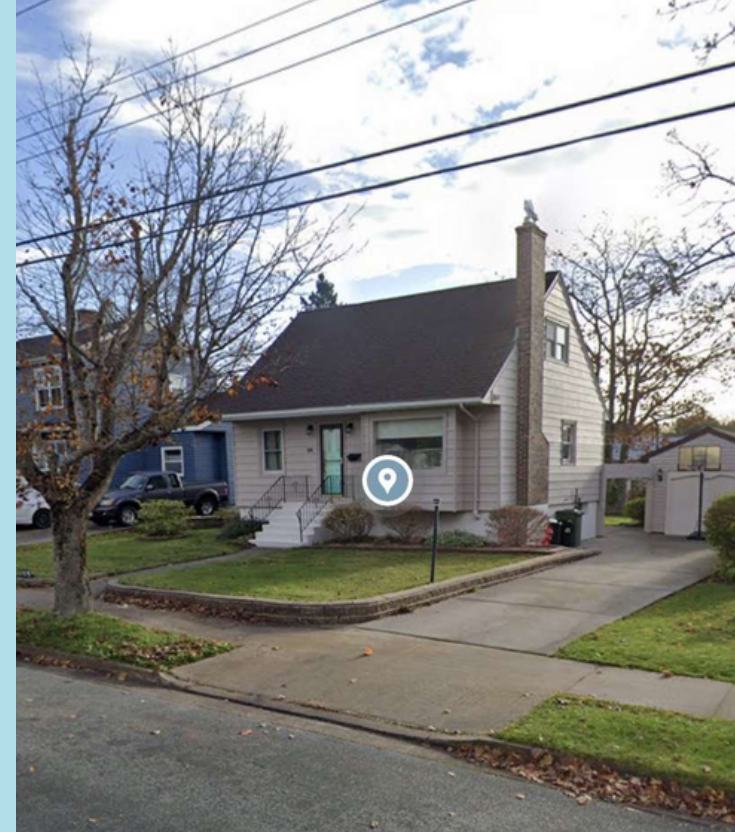

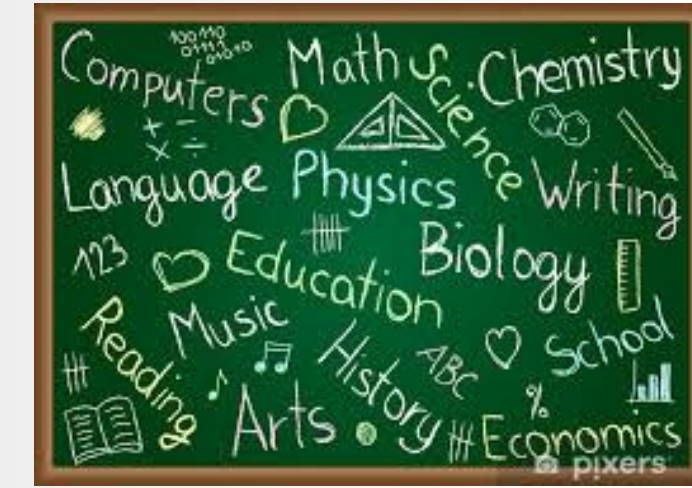

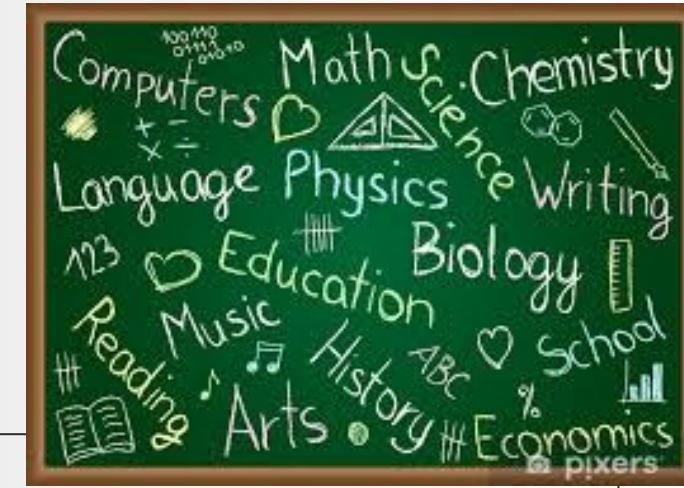
With a big family, the festivities were my personal favourite part of the year.

1:45-3	Global History/Canadian History	<p>Cad. History is organized around five questions in Canada's history. These questions form the basis for five of the six units in the course: Globalization, Development, Sovereignty, Governance, and Justice. The sixth unit, Independent Study, engages students in a specific piece of historical research.</p> <p>Global History explores major contemporary global issues, using the discipline of history, in an attempt to answer the question, "How did the world arrive at its current state at the beginning of the twenty-first century?" is organized into six units: The Global Historian, The Dynamics of Geo-Political Power, The Challenge of Economic Disparity, The Pursuit of Justice, and Societal Change.</p>

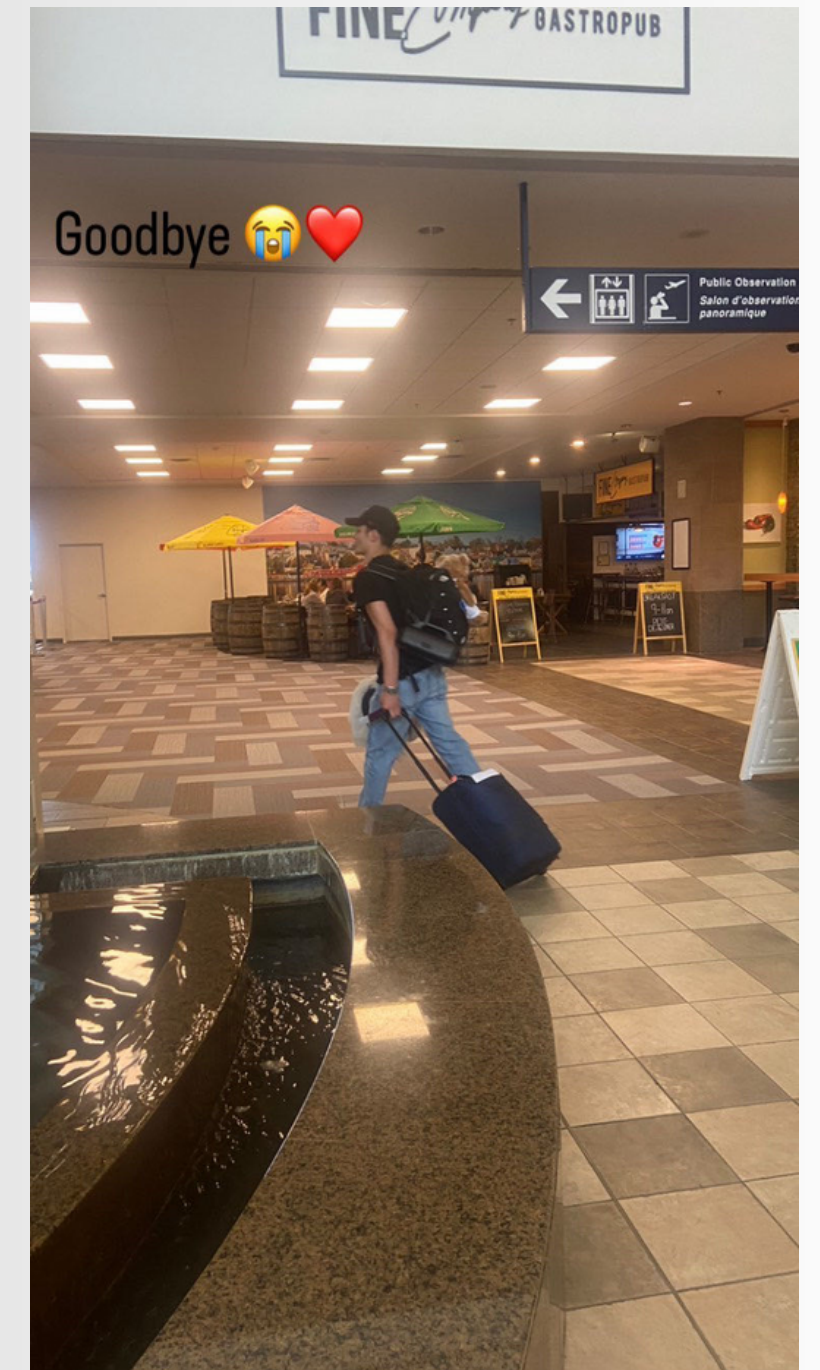

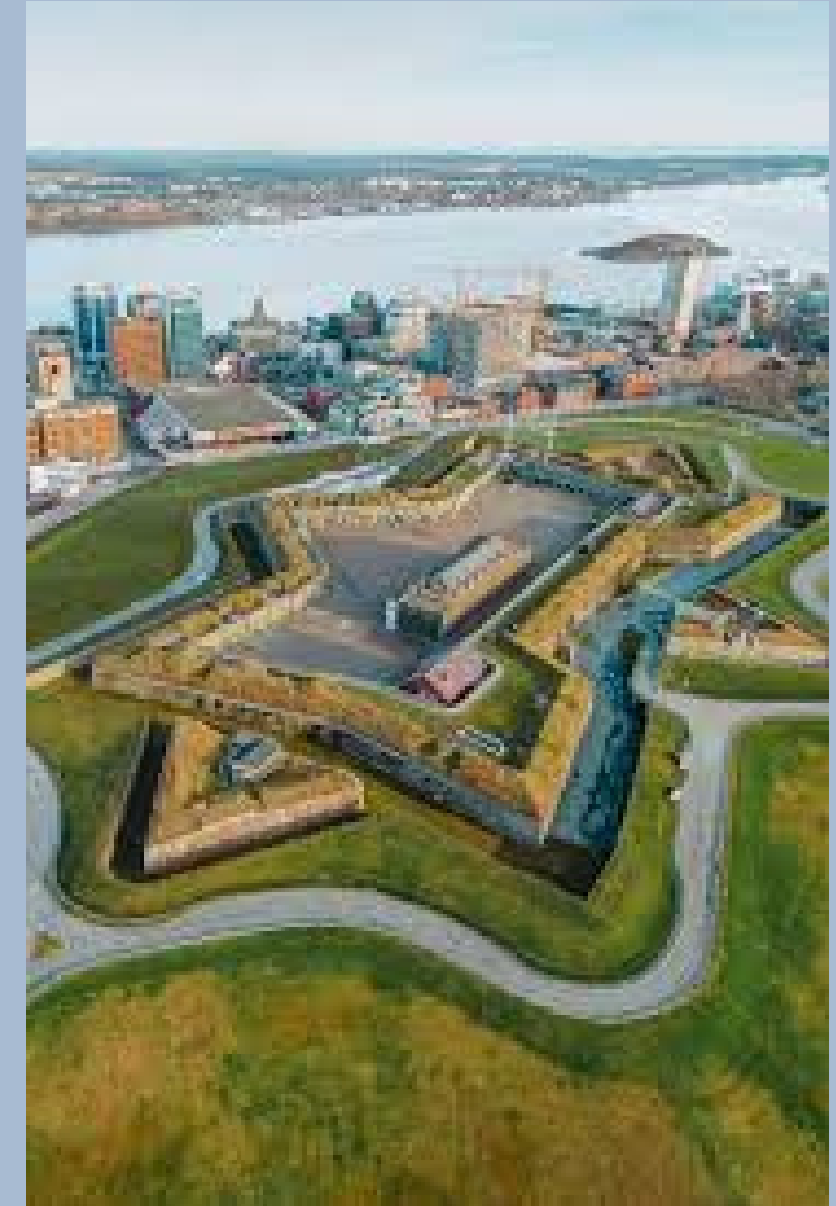
